# Tulalip Tribal Police-Drug Task Force (DTF)

October 6, 2023



The Tulalip Tribal Police Department has received tips reported by concerned citizens regarding suspicious narcotics activities at the Marathon Gas station located in Tulalip, WA. Detectives with the Tulalip Drug Task Force (DTF) investigated and learned of narcotics sales occurring at this gas station located on the Tulalip Reservation. The DTF Detectives identified an employee who was suspected of selling narcotics while at work.

This week DTF Detectives were able to establish probable cause to arrest the employee for two counts of possession with the intent to distribute. On Friday, October 6, 2023, after learning that the employee was working, Tulalip Patrol Officers and DTF Detectives arrested the suspect on probable cause. The suspect was booked into the Snohomish County Jail on the narcotics violation charges.
