On July 19, 2022, at approximately 12:30 p.m. Tulalip Bay Fire, Marysville Fire, Tulalip Tribal Police, and the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office Patrol and Collision Investigations Unit responded to a call about a motor vehicle accident near Sunny Shores and Marine Drive.

The reporting party was looking for a missing relative. GPS had narrowed the person's location to the Sunny Shores area. The reporting party stated that they had found the person's truck over a 100-foot embankment and at the bottom of a ravine. The driver was non-responsive. The family called emergency services.

After Tulalip Bay Fire along the Marysville Fire arrived, they rappelled to the truck. They extracted the driver, a Native American male who had passed away due to his injuries.

Tulalip Tribal Police, with the assistance of the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office North Patrol area Deputy and their Collision Investigation Unit, are investigating the accident.
